



Cottontail's Carrot Patch Kit Instructions

- Step 1** Use your foam brush and begin with painting the bunny & base with the weathered gray colored paint and then set it aside to dry.
- Step 2** Take out the brown paint and apply to the wood carrots using the wet wipe provided. This will help us achieve a stained look.
- Step 3** Once your bunny is dry, use your bristle brush to apply the white paint. Wipe off the excess paint so that your brush is almost dry. We used very little paint in this step. This is just to give a little bit of a distressed look. Rinse and dry your brush before moving to the next step.
- Step 4** While the bunny dries, use the white sponges to paint the small wood carrot cut outs. Dab the excess paint from your sponge and use light coats. Be mindful to not get paint on the edges of the cutouts. Since these are laser-cut pieces the edges do not always cover well. Once they are painted, set them aside to dry.
- Step 5** Using the same technique as we did above, use your bristle brush again to apply the orange paint to your wood carrots. Again, using very little paint allows some of the brown to still show through and give a distressed look.
- Step 6** Now grab your stencil, flip it over and carefully peel off the back. Think of it as a big sticker and you are taking the back of the sticker off. Once the sticky part of the stencil is exposed, flip it over and place it on your bunny.
- Then press it down really well. You can use a debit card (or something similar). Then slowly peel off the white layer, making sure the stencil stays in place. Now you are ready to paint!
- Step 7** Next, take out your black paint and a white sponge, dip your sponge into the paint, wipe off the excess paint, and then dab up and down on the stencil. Don't use too much paint as it works best with 2 thin coats! Less is more! Once it's covered with a couple of thin coats, you can peel off the stencil.
- Step 8** Use the burlap and twine to make the bow.
- Step 9** Once everything is dry, use the glue provided to glue your carrot cutouts and bow onto the bunny. Then place a little bit of glue onto the green raffia and place the pieces into the holes on the big carrots.

Step 10

This step is optional, but you can use a flat screwdriver or putty knife to add lines into your large carrots.

Step 11
