



Lucky Kit Instructions

- Step 1** Take out the brown paint and apply to the base of your sign using the wet wipe provided. This will help us achieve a stained look. Let this dry completely before moving to the next step.
- Step 2** Once your base is dry, use your foam brush to apply the white paint. We used very little paint and left some of the brown showing through to give that distressed look. Rinse and dry your foam brush before moving to the next step.
- Step 3** While the base of your sign dries, use your foam brush to paint the wood cut out. Be mindful to not get paint on the edges of the cutouts. Since these are laser-cut pieces the edges do not always cover well. Once it is painted, set it aside to dry.
- Step 4** Now grab your shamrock stencil, flip it over and carefully peel off the back. Think of it as a big sticker and you are taking the back of the sticker off. Once the sticky part of the stencil is exposed, flip it over and place it on your board.
- Step 5** Then press it down really well. You can use a debit card (or something similar). Then slowly peel off the white layer, making sure the stencil stays in place. Now you are ready to paint!
- Step 6** Next, take out your green paint and the white sponge, dip your sponge into the paint, wipe off the excess paint, and then dab up and down on the stencil. Don't use too much paint as it works best with 2 thin coats! Less is more! Once it's covered with a couple of thin coats, you can peel off the stencil. We used the small brush provided to add some additional distressing with our white paint after the green dried.
- Step 7** Once all of your pieces are painted & dry, use the glue provided to glue your word onto the board.
- Step 8** This step is optional, but we used the small brush to add some extra details to the shamrock and the word.
- Step 9** Now step back & admire your new St. Patrick's Day project. Make sure to take a picture of your creation and tag us on social media @thecreativegetaway because we love seeing your creations.
